## CANADA'S COUNTRY MUSIC

In the May 2nd 1966 issue of RPM we headlined a story "CANADIAN COUNTRY SHAPES UP", What we forgot to add was "OR SHIPS OUT". The impending explosion of Canadian country sounds fizzled out. NOW, six months later, we're getting ready for another try at cracking the Canadian sound barrier. This time, however, we are much better prepared for the world market. New studios, new engineers and producers have combined to give us that refreshingly new Canadian sound. George Taylor's Montreal based Rodeo firm has taken advantage of the fantastic sound available at Stereo Sound Studios through the production and engineering skills of Maurice Bougu and Jack Raskin. The new Bob King single "Walking On The Country Road" is a product of SSS. In Toronto there are three studios capable of supplying that much needed competitive sound. Phil Anderson, general manager of Bay Music has acquired the services of Dave Leonard as studio co-ordinator and chief recording engineer for the Bay studios. Leonard was formerly with Beltone Studios in New York City. Bob Gray, manager of the RCA Victor studios, reports an increase in label work and the added interest of country artists, in the facilities available at the RCA studios. It has been reported that a major indie of pop product will soon be recording Canadian country artists at RCA Victor. Hallmark Studios have also been busy creating product for the big explosion. Bob Martin, advertising and promotion manager for Columbia Records, has turned his talents toward producing. His first successful country production was "Loving You Again" by Johnny Burke. His follow-up, also produced by Martin "Loving Day" has already been aired by Ralph Emery of WSM in Nashville. Martin productions were at Hallmark.

Capitol's director of artists & repertoire, Paul White, has begun a giant push on their Canadian artists, namely Diane Leigh with her single "Why Can't He Be You" and Gary Buck and his release of "The Weatherman". Bruce Shaver introduced the country to his artist Odie Workman with his Bison production of "Jacka Built A House" and has now released "Take This Heart Of Mine" on Sparton.

Columbia's Mercey Bros. have bounced onto the scene with their strong release of "Whistling On The River". Country, MOT and GMP stations from coast to coast are leaning heavily on what could be the first national breakthrough for Canadian country artists.

Country music can be a very important export for Canada, and with the winning combination of those mentioned above, it would look as though we are on the right track. This week we have set down in alphabetical order, by artist, the country singles available. We will, each week, tabulate the national popularity of these discs. We have also listed the radio country stations and their personalities.

Canadian country productions and artists are greater than ever. There is no need to expose a Canadian disc out of sympathy. The better part of all releases have it in the grooves and are capable of competing with any imported product. SUPPORT YOUR CANADIAN COUNTRY SCENE — IT'S GOOD FOR YOU.

# LET'S GET A FEW THINGS STRAIGHT.... PART TWO BY ELVIRA CAPREESE

This week, the second installment of my quiz to Old Ed:, I continue to ask him questions that readers want the answers to. If you have any questions, please send them to me.

EC: As editor of RPM, you have your finger on pulse of the industry in this country. How about a progress report.

WG: I'm going to be honest with you Ellie. In the past three years of publishing RPM, I have seen a great deal happen. The industry has grown, but there are two sore points. Programmers still do not program with consistency. I mean, the records that make it, don't make it in enough markets. If a record gets acceptance in 10 areas, that can be it. The other 32 areas don't program it, the net total is a part of a hit. Perhaps legislation is the answer. I hope it can improve by itself. If it doesn't, the government will surely step in with Canadian content requirements. Whatever is necessary is alright with me. Secondly, the lack of production other than "pop" music, on the part of record companies. Good LPs aren't being recorded and possibly record companies should try to come up with a few CTL type of products that could be bought in stores.

EC: Why doesn't RPM feature more news about GMP recordings and programming?

WG: There is a general lack of interest on the part of the staid old broadcasters. There is a lack of interest on the part of record companies (as I have indicated in my last answer) I think the answer is to FIRST build a solid "pop" music industry and the good music will follow. We really haven't set the world on fire with the "easy", and the "difficult" will have to wait.

FC: A reader wrote me sometime ago asking

why RPM didn't expose the problems in the music industry. Why don't we name names?

WG: I read the letter you are referring to. It is very easy for readers to ask us to stick our necks out, but at the word "payola" you can remember what happened. It isn't easy to get the goods on these undercover dealings in the industry, and too often a story that will expose the gangster element in the industry will harm the people who are on the level and hurt the industry. It usually works out that the industry takes care of these people, eventually. Meanwhile, everyone is keeping an eye on the situation. Doesn't it usually work itself out?

EC: How come we give the same value to a U.S. produced Canadian single as we do to a Canadian produced single?

WG: We have to start somewhere, but once we have a good industry established, we won't be so generous. Right now we are still saying yes to pseudo Canadian discs, but not for much longer.

EC: Groups have always complained about how they are treated when they visit a radio station with their new release. What is RPM's attitude towards groups who visit?

WG: Anyone in the industry is welcome to the RPM offices. We like to have some advance warning that they are coming, but they are always treated with respect and we like to meet them. Many many groups already know about our open door policy. Many groups come in to discuss their problems. We are most anxious to meet the people we write about. Just phone ahead to make sure we can accomodate one group at a time. (We have a very small reception area.)

EC: How is it that a record in the CCCA can be No.17 and no station listings are indicated?

WG: Position is determined by the points scored on some 52 charts and playlists that come into RPM, voluntarily, each week. A sampling of 15 charts is given each week. Sometimes the charts where the listings appear aren't used, but rest assured, this is an accurate tabulation. EC: Can RPM hype a record?

WG: Many approaches are made to us to hype a record, but the formula stands in all our computations. We ask disc jockeys to review on Sounding Board, and CCCA is compiled from chart submissions and the figures are not tampered with. We cannot hype anyone's record. Our theory is "Tell your story in an ad" and if the record has what it takes and the company promotes and advertises, it WILL be a hit. I have yet to have a direct answer to what record was ever "hyped". Maybe someone in the industry can tell US how we can hype anyone's product. The whole thing is silly. But, a good newsworthy press release can always be an assist. A FEW people in the industry do make sure we get their stories, and usually they get printed. The record industry in Canada is very young. What initiative do you really need to sell pre-sold hits? You asked me to be honest.

Jess Taylor, of Taylor's One Stop, has found good acceptance,by her dealers, of the RPM 100. Most of the dealers are using the RPM 100 for their ordering. One complaint from Jess. Canadian product is hard to come by. It might be a good idea for record companies to look into the present set-up of availability of Canadian product, remembering that filling the needs of the spontaneous buyer can mean the difference between great profit and none at all.

Frank McMeekin, sales manager at the Heaton Music Studio in Fonthill, reports good sales for "Hazel", "Mr. Spaceman"and "Dandy" as well as "Lady Godiva" and "Born Free". Moving well are "Born Free" and "Louie" with "She Ain't No Use To Me" topping the sales for Canadian singles. "Revolver" and "Tijuana Brass" are still the best selling albums.

Ed Wilson reports from Wilson & Lee in Oshawa that "Whistle On The River" has been chalking up good sales for the Mercey Bros. The talented trio helped boost record sales with their recent appearance at Harry's Hideaway, in the motor city. "Hazel" and "Godiva" top the best sellers with "Renee" and the Stone's "Mother" moving into place. Keith's "Lie" is also considered a part of the top action. Mitch Ryder's "Blue Dress" is starting to move along with the Lovin' Spoonful's "Rain" and Ben Colder's "Almost Persuaded No. 2". "Symbolize" catches the Canadian action. The Brothers In Law have been doing well with their "Strike Back" LP. The Buck Owens album "At Carnegie Hall" and Bert Kaempfert's "Greatest Hits" are the top selling LPs, with the younger set grabbing for the Monkees.

Louise Giroux is the new hit buyer at Sherman's Rack Sales in Ottawa. Louise has had six years experience in records and is well known among record people in the capital. Sales of "Heartbreak Hotel" by the local group, the Scoundrelz, have been very brisk as well as Lightfoot's "Spin". The latter had appeared recently at Ottawa's Le Hibou. "Psychotic Reaction" and "Renee" are among the top sellers. The Troggs' "Control" and the "Picture" entry by Lewis are both running neck in neck with "Rain" and "Louie". The Monkees cop top spot for album sales while the new entry by the Mama's and Papa's moves off to a good start.

Mrs. Boyd, who looks after the bar at Morgan's in the Eglinton Square Plaza, lists "Dandy", "Renee", River's "Town", "Nineteen Days" and "Good Vibrations" as being on top of their best sellers list. "Godiva" and "Rain" arealso experiencing action. "Symbolize You" takes the action for Canadian entry. The Monkees steal the action on LPs here as well.

Arnold Tiegs' record department at Carl Heintzman's in Kitchener, has had good sales action for "Posey's "Woman", Roe's "Hazel" and Darin's "Carpenter". "Picture" and "96 Tears" are also capturing good sales. The Happenings are making it with their "Girl" along with Hebb's "Satisfied Mind". Martino's "Wheel Of Hurt" looks like a winner.

Vicki Paige gives top action to "Renee" at her Richmond Hill Music Centre but "Spin-Out" and "Nineteen Days" are running close behind. "Godiva" and "Hazel" are still making the sales scene. Ryder's "Dress" and "Picture" are selling steadily as well as the Canadian entry "Symbolize". New sellers on the move include "Winchester Cathedral" and "Good Vibrations". The Monkees take the top of the album heap but Dylan's double pack is the big surprise seller. Sales are being made, sight unseen, the numbers aren't listed on the outside of the album. The Abbey Tavern Singers are grabbing some early Christmas action with their new album release. Tijuana Brass are constant sellers as well as the soundtrack from "Dr. Zhivago".



From The Lakehead, **Rick Honey** sends news of a lineup change at CKPR. **Don Burns** is the new voice of the night (MN to 6 AM) and has already been affectionately tabbed D.J. Burns. Don was formerly with CKDM in Dauphin.

Ron Waddell would like to let the nation know that one big Canadian record to keep an ear on is "In A Minute Or Two" by Dee and The Yeomen. Says Ron "The best Canadian release to come along in a long time". The first week on CKDM's "Super 73 Fall Fun Survey" rates it at No. 49 for the Dauphin listeners.

From "The Capital Of Canadian Music", Belleville, CJBQ's Dave Charles sends news that he has just completed four successful weeks on the CBC "Action Set" show and used his knowledge of Canadian product and his pro-Canadian feeling to good advantage. The latest Dave's Gig turned out to be a huge success. Helping to bring out the crowds were Ottawa's Staccatos, Montreal's M.G. and The Escorts, and an exciting group from Hamilton known as The Sleepers.

Denis Menard's CKBC listeners in the Bathurst area have swung right behind him in his picking of "La Poupee Qui Fait Non" by Les Sultans. The reaction hasn't been restricted to his French listeners but has captured the attention of his English listeners as well. Even local groups have included the tune in their repertoire.
